Social Services staff verifies that a friend or family member or an agency at their destination will receive and support the individual or family. Relocation services can also be provided to an individual or family if there verification of an offer of employment with a verified start date. The purpose of the program is to assist individuals and/or families who can be better served by relocating to a destination that provides a reconnection to family or friends or with employment opportunities that will lead to self-sufficiency.

- 2. develop a seamless response to potential acts of bioterrorism or natural disasters that includes public health, medical care, and emergency/disaster management systems;
- 3. ensure that rapid and secure communication exists among public health and other public or private agencies during any public health emergency.
