DNIEC's After-school Program is a great success, despite numerous challenges brought on by the Covid-19 pandemic. Due to a lack of transportation, our students' daily attendance decreased significantly. However, the regular attendees are enjoying more intensive, individualized tutoring sessions.

Although help with homework takes precedent at DNIEC, after-school program attendees also read for twenty minutes, complete a journal entry and do academic worksheets. The students enjoyed the cultural activity so much, DNIEC and Title VI Indian Education Program were invited to visit the class on Friday mornings, this spring. DNIEC and Title VI look forward to providing these activities regularly!

DNIEC will also give the TUPE presentations to American Indian students at Crescent Elk Middle School, in-person, this spring.

In addition to providing in-person presentations at DNHS, DNIEC also gave online presentations via zoom to NCIDC's Da'Luk Youth Group, a substance abuse prevention group that meets virtually for Native Youth in Del Norte and Humboldt Counties.
