### ADULT COUNSELOR APPLICATION

United Indian Health Services, Inc. (UIHS) thanks you for your interest in our *May-Gay-Tolh-Kwe* (“a healing place” in the Yurok language) Youth Summer Day Camp 2022, which will be held

- June 27-July 1, 2022 at the Potawot Health Village in Arcata
- July 11-15, 2022 at the Elk Valley Rancheria Community Center in Crescent City
- July 18-22, 2022 at Resighini Rancheria Community Center in Klamath
- July 25-29, 2022 at Morek Won Community Center in Weitchpec

All staff will be required to arrive at the UIHS day camp location by 8 am Monday – Friday and remain until all campers are picked up daily.

All summer day camp staff is required to attend a leadership training prior to camp. The training will include team-building activities, an overview of the roles/responsibilities of staff, basic first aid training and emergency protocol, and a review of the camp agenda. This will be a chance for summer day camp staff to get acquainted with one another and develop their leadership skills!

*May-Gay-Tolh-Kwe Youth Summer Day Camp 2022 will provide safe and positive experiences for American Indian community youth ages 9-11 and 12-17 who are registered with UIHS. Campers will be introduced to local cultural traditions and have the opportunity to participate in many activities that promote and encourage healthy lifestyle choices.*

*Cultural activities will include necklace making, storytelling, and traditional games. Presentations & activities on health & wellness related topics such as diabetes prevention, self-esteem building, nutrition, recycling and environmental education. Campers will also participate in daily hikes, nature walks, games and various physical activities.*

**UIHS YOUTH SUMMER DAY CAMP  
ADULT COUNSELOR JOB DESCRIPTION**

REPORTS TO:           CAMP COORDINATOR/ DIRECTOR  
SUPERVISES:         YOUTH COUNSELOR & CAMPERS

**GENERAL FUNCTIONS:**

Work in conjunction with other adult and peer camp counselors to supervise campers, ages 9-11 years and 12-17 years, and implement duties and responsibilities as assigned by camp coordinators. Utilize skills to motivate and encourage campers to participate in all camp activities and to serve as a positive role model by leading by example and participating in all camp activities.

**MAJOR TASKS AND RESPONSIBILITIES:**

- Be responsible for primary supervision of campers and youth counselors.
- Be a positive role model and demonstrate respect to campers, counselors, staff, elder and guest presenters.
- Participate in all group activities and workshops; this can include physical activity such as hiking and sports.
- Provide assistance to camp coordinators, counselors, and camp guest presenters as requested.
- Demonstrate an open willingness to share traditional and cultural knowledge that motivate campers to participate in workshops and activities.
- Report any inappropriate activity and behavior to the camp coordinator.
- Practice confidentiality.
- Acquaint yourself with counselor roles and responsibilities, emergency protocol, first aid kit, camp agenda, camp boundaries, etc.
- Do not engage in inappropriate behavior such as: profanity, physical violence, verbal abuse and sexual misconduct, consumption or possession of any controlled substance. No tobacco use will be permitted.

**MINIMUM JOB REQUIREMENTS:**

Must be a high school graduate and at least eighteen years old, by June 24, 2022, must be drug and alcohol free, must possess the ability to work with American Indian youth in group settings. Personal knowledge of local American Indian culture and heritage preferred. Pursuant to Public Law 93-638, preference will be given to persons of American Indian descent.
